Ozanam Charitable Pharmacy is among 71 awardees that received a grant from Direct Relief's Fund for Health Equity, which mobilizes financial resources for organizations focused on non-clinical interventions that affect a person's health. Commonly known as the social determinants of health, these factors include an individual's physical, social, cultural, and economic environment.



Auburn University's Harrison School of Pharmacy Students: Learning and Growing at Ozanam

Emily Whitehurst, P4 Student from Grand Bay, Alabama:

I chose to pursue pharmacy because I wanted to help people prioritize their health without touching blood! I love helping people anyway I can, and when I found out more about pharmacy by working in one, I felt that this was definitely my calling, especially seeing the impact it makes to help people get what they need and see improvements in their health over time! During my time at Ozanam, I learned a lot about the many services they provide, which are different from regular pharmacies. For instance, there is a lot of coordination with other agencies here at Ozanam to ensure the patient is being assisted with all their needs, not just prescriptions and over the counter medications which can be provided here. I was able to experience a lot of different activities at Ozanam, but I spent most of my time reaching out to patients and checking if they needed supplies or refills on their medications, as well as checking to see if they had any questions. I also assisted with health screenings for our brand new Nutrition program, where participants have their blood pressure, weight, and waist circumference measured monthly as they are given boxes of fresh fruit and vegetables monthly to assist with healthy eating! In addition to the food boxes, these patients also got information sheets detailing ways to get children to eat more fruits and veggies and tips on how to eat more protein, another important nutrient. Following these screenings, I was able to get in touch with patients' doctor's offices and let them know the results, if the patient wanted this done. I also got to attend a Career and Health Resource Fair with Ozanam in South Baldwin County where I got to share the work that we do at Ozanam and provide information on how to become a patient, not only with individuals, but also with other agencies in attendance so the could refer people. My favorite part of working with Ozanam has been seeing the effects their services have on the patients and seeing what a difference is being made. My time at Ozanam has really opened my eyes to the needs of the community I'm serving, as well as taught me some ways to help with those needs as I move forward into my own pharmacy practice.

2023 PROJECT HOMELESS CONNECT

Hosted by Housing First, Inc., this one-day resource fair has served the residents experiencing homelessness in Mobile and Baldwin counties since 2014. Together, we have been able to provide vital services, free of charge, to those most in need in our community.
